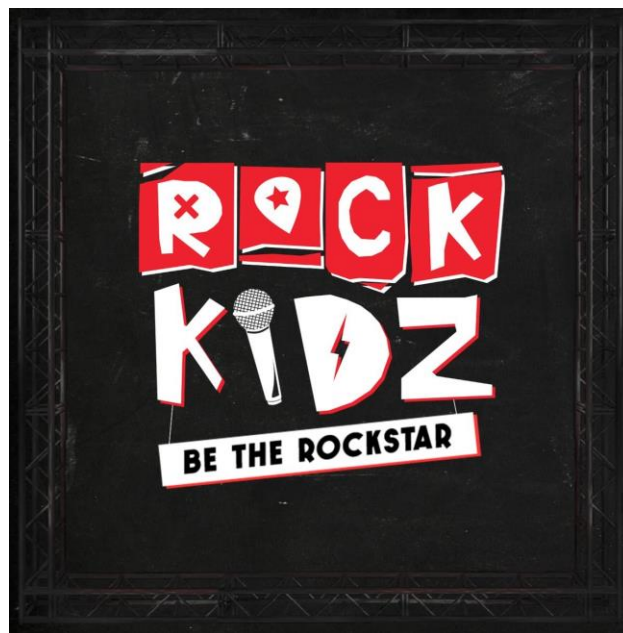




## Newsletter Friday 26th April

## Household Support Fund

The government have committed further funds to the Household Support Fund. Those families already in receipt of the fund will continue to be paid the fund and do not need to do anything. If eligible you will receive a minimum of £90 and the release of funding is around school holidays in order to support families with meals when schools are closed. 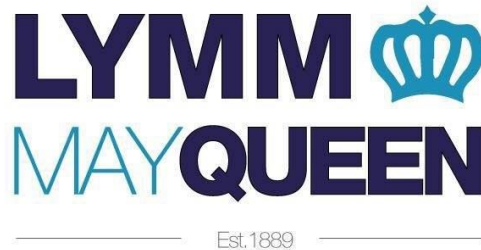
## School Meals

If you are wanting to purchase either a school snack or meal for your child, then please be advised your ParentPay account must be in credit at all times. School meals and snacks are provided by The School Meals Department at Warrington Borough Council, they do not carry any debt and no credit is given.

Snacks are 25p per day (£1.25 per week) and lunch is £2.60 per day (£13.00 per week) - please pay in advance of the week ahead or provide your child with a snack / packed lunch if you are unable to do so.

Please check your account over the weekend and bring up to date if necessary.
